BY GLENN FRANK Few can be found to defend prejudice. The nuisance of its narrowness is obvious, and hurling a stone of sarcasm at prejudice is always good for a round of ringing applause. And yet we go gaily on with most of our actions dictated by sheer prejudice. Why? E. L. Clarke, in his Art of Straight Thinking, suggests five buttresses of prejudice that are worth identifying. First, most of us do not realize that we are moved by prejudice. We can spot prejudice in the seventeenth century. We can recognize bias in the life of the bolshevik. We can see narrowness in our neighbors. But it is not easy to know when we are ourselves biased and blind in our own reactions. Second, many men honestly believe that a certain amount of nar-

Vocation Quiz To Be Directed by Prof. At Stanford

Dr. E. K. Strong, professor at Stanford University, announced yesterday that the Carnegie Foundation of New York has appropriated \$40,000 for use in conducting a research on the educational progress and vocational problems of the second generation Japanese in America.

If this amount, \$20,000 will be awarded within the year 1930 and the remainder of \$20,000 before the end of 1931, for the furtherance of this survey. If the survey cannot be completed with this amount, further appropriations from the Carnegie Foundation will be forthcoming.

Prof. Strong, who has been engaged to direct this undertaking, has begun a series of personal interviews with leading Japanese and Americans of the state with view to obtaining their opinions as to the best method of conducting this research.

Among other suggestions, plan to encourage citizens of Japanese ancestry in Hawaii to settle on the mainland and undertake some profitable work here will be studied by this research body. The suggestion was made by Chester Rowell, noted California publicist, who in an interview with Dr. Strong declared that Continental America may offer more opportunities for a Hawaii-born Japanese, whose emigration to this mainland may be beneficial to both Hawaii and the States.

London Parley Will Be In Session Over 6 Months, Is Belief

LONDON, Jan. 8.—The negotiations now being conducted by the American Embassy officials for leasing of houses in London for accommodating delegates, are taken by observers here that the United States believes the naval parley will be in session for more than six months. No new developments were indicated today as a result of yesterday's conference between Sir Arthur Henderson, British Foreign Secretary, and the Japanese delegates to the naval conference. Great Britain neither brought forward new counter-proposals relative to Japan's demand for a 10-10-7 ratio in auxiliary ships, nor did it express disagreement to the Japanese stance.

The entire British nation will offer prayer on Jan. 13, the Sunday before the opening of the parley, in order to evoke the guidance of the Supreme Statesman to finish the conference to a successful finish.
