JAPAN LABOR OPENS DRIVE IN ELECTION

Brilliant Hindu And Woman Speakers In Campaign Talks

Special To The Japanese American News TOKYO, Feb. 5.—Two brilliant speakers, one a Hindu and the other a Japanese woman textile worker, took the limelight today in the campaign now being conducted by proletarian candidates for seats in the next Diet.

The Hindu, who is a political refugee in this country, spoke with extraordinary eloquence in Japanese for the election of Ryusaku Miyazaki, candidate from the National Proletarian Party, in a campaign now conducted in the Fukagawa district of this city. The Hindu speaker stressed the brotherhood of all proletarians and the need of liberating the workers in India from the oppressions of the British regime.

WOMAN IN CAMPAIGN

The other speaker to attract the attention of public today is Miss Ayako Okamura, 23, who delivered an impassioned address for the election of Komachi Matsuo, a candidate from the social Democratic party.

Miss Okamura, who is from the mountain district of Nagano prefecture, first came to the attention of the people by her leadership in the strike conducted last year by 2,000 women workers employed by the Tokyo Muslin Company. She conducted so spirited a fight against the operators in this strike that her forces eventually won.

After being fired by the company for her part in the strike, she returned to her native country of Nagano, where she again led labor-outrage conducted by women employed in the silk industry there.

MISS OKUMA

Miss Okamura is an eloquent speaker. In her present campaign speeches for Matsuo, she stresses the need of greater representation of working people in the Diet in order that their conditions may be improved and the exploitation of the capitalist group may be curbed.

BYAKUREN RAISES \$300

Ryusaku Miyazaki, the proletarian candidate, today announced his budget for the coming election. The total amounts to only \$300. Out of this sum 800 yen has been raised by his "soul mate," Madame Byakuren, who donated the entire proceeds of her literary endeavors to her husband-lover. Byakuren is a popular poetess, and she came into national prominence some time ago when she deserted her husband, a wealthy Kyushu coal magnate, for Miyazaki, her lover.

1200 YEN TO BE SUBSCRIBED

Miyazaki has already raised 1,000 yen himself, but there is yet 200 yen to be subscribed before his budget is completed.

Following the example of the Social Democratic party, the Japanese Proletarian Party is expected to issue a statement outlining its prospective election expenditures. Already 796 candidates have been put into the field by the various political parties in the forthcoming election. Out of this number the Minseitai government leads with 352 candidates.

Castle Touches on London Parley in Address in Tokyo

TOKYO, Feb. 4.—(UP)—Assurance that his mission to Japan was one of cooperation was stressed tonight by William Castle Jr., American special consular representative to Japan, at a dinner in his honor by the America Japan Society.

"Whatever may be accomplished at London, I am sure none will suggest to Japan any sacrifice that either will endanger its national security or challenge its respondent naval strength in the Orient," Castle said.

No single nation will be asked to make all the sacrifices, he declared. In emphasizing that it is impossible to foresee the naval needs of the future, Castle pointed out that aviation has changed the whole scheme of naval warfare. "Shortly airplanes may settle on the decks of the smallest ships as a dove alights on a dovecot," he said. "When this is true, we may desire the smallest instead of the largest cruiser."

Miss Toyo Domoto, secretary of the local Japanese Center, and Miss Sumie Yamamoto, secretary of the San Francisco Japanese Y. W. C. A., led discussion groups.

Buddhist People Will Hear Lecture by Dr. Thompson Sunday

Dr. Thompson, well known psycho-analyst and lecturer, will address the local Buddhist Church Sunday School on Sunday morning, Feb. 10, at 10 a. m. in the Temple auditorium on Pine Street. The first lecture starts at 10 a. m.

Dr. Thompson was formerly a surgeon in the United States Navy. A Buddhist scholar of note, he has been active in the Buddhist circles of Honolulu until his arrival here recently.

While his topic is unannounced, Dr. Thompson is expected to talk on Buddhism and its relations to the second generation people. WHAT WAR COSTS US

BY GLENN FRANK As I write the Naval Conference is swinging into action in London. I want to give, if I can, some vivid sense of what the success or failure of this conference and like negotiations means to the man in the street. I shall not dip my brush in blood and paint the revolting picture of war that might be painted. I shall content myself with stating certain bare facts of what war costs us. Eighty-two per cent of all the revenues of the United States government goes into the dual job of paying for past wars or preparing for future wars. We cry aloud for economy in government. We slow down our road building and let the farmer slip and slide to market on mud roads. We cook a critical eye at every added dollar that is asked for the education of our sons and daughters. Statesmanship ceases to be the creative guidance of a nation's culture and becomes the miser mission of pinching pennies. If we really want to cut taxes—and what people does not—we might do it if a conspiracy of the civilized peoples of earth would consistently boycott every statesman who fails to do everything within his power to stop the social suicide of war. What will future generations say of a people that cannot manage to reserve about its war costs more than eighteen cents out of every tax dollar? See what has happened to the cost of navies among the nations now in conference during the last twenty-five years: In 1904 Italy spent \$23,522,400 on her navy. In 1929 she spent 63,022,740. In 1904 France spent \$69,740,222 on her navy. In 1929 she spent \$99,568,000. In 1904 Japan spent \$17,553,279 on
