## COURT HOLDS WIFE OF JAPANESE IN DOMESTIC TRADE MAY ENTER U. S.

### Rules Restricting Scope of U. S. -- Japanese Commerce Pact to International Trade Merchants Held Voice by U. S. Court

Much jubilation is expressed by the Japanese community over the sweeping victory achieved Monday when Justice of the United States Circuit Court of Appeals handed down a decision upholding the right of Mrs. Yoshiko Kumanomido, wife of a Los Angeles newspaper editor, to enter the United States by authority of the Japanese American Commercial treaty as a non-immigrant under the Immigration Law of 1924.

## New Specimen of Bacteria Is Found By Japan Emperor

Special To The Japanese American News TOKYO, April 8.—His Imperial Majesty the Emperor has discovered a new specimen of bacterium at the Akasaka detached palace recently. He had made a report of his findings to London, and a reply was received by His Majesty today from Dr. Lister, noted woman scholar of the Imperial Bureau of National History at London. In her report she listed the new germ as *Hermitekia Imperialis* Lister.

5. The right of an editor, employed by a publisher, to enter the United States is vouchsafed in the treaty which expressly provides that the Japanese subject shall have the right "to employ agents of their choice... incident to or necessary for trade."

## 3 TO 1 VOTE

The decision was rendered by a two to one vote, Circuit Justices Dietrich and Wilbur sustaining the majority opinion and Justice Kerrigan casting the dissenting ballot. The present case involves an appeal from the order and judgement of the district court. Mrs. Kumanomido's husband, Yoshimi Kumanomido, is a Japanese subject and managing editor of the Los Angeles Japanese American News.

## BIG ARMY OF UNEMPLOYED STIRS JAPAN

### Gov't Is Blamed For Hard Time and Lack of Work

Special To The Japanese American News TOKYO, April 8.—The appalling increase in unemployment and the continuous depression in business are the two specters that face the present Hamaguchi's Cabinet, causing no little concern in both the official and non-official circles.

## GRAVE SITUATION

Because of the present Cabinet's tendency to stabilize the big business interests, giving them government protection at the expense of the common worker, a wide-spread discontent is being fomented from beneath. Unless alleviating measures are taken, a storm of popular disapproval may become uncontrollable and result in the downfall of the Minsito power.

## WAR AGAINST CAPITALISM

The proletariat, taking this Osaka incident as a spur, are uniting their "battle-line" for a war against capitalism. The Setyukai, or the chief opposition party, together with the labor deputy, Yukuo Oyama, are expected to introduce a non-confidence bill against Minister of Finance Junnosuke Inouye at the forthcoming special session of the Diet, convening on April 21.
