6 INVENTIONS ACHIEVED BY HAWAII MAN

Contract Signed for
Making Self-Feed
Tooth Brushes

HONOLULU, July 10.—"Richman, poorman, beggarman, thief, doctor, lawyer, Indian chief." And why shouldn't that apply to the second generation? In this case the particular second generation even goes beyond the category mentioned.

David Masaki Kiyota, 33 year old American citizen residing in this city, is an inventor, and a prolific one at that.

Kiyota has six inventions to his credit all of them perfected at about the same time. They are automatic tooth brush, two-in-one shoe brush, two-in-one shaving brush, crown cap, automatic oil stove heater, and direction lights for automobiles and airplanes.

Several months ago Kiyota made a trip to Japan. He returned to Honolulu recently bringing back with him documents issued by the patent bureau of the Japanese government bearing testimony that patents had been issued by that government for each of his six inventions. In the meantime American patent rights have been applied for at the United States patent bureau at Washington, D.C.

AUTOMATIC TOOTH BRUSH

The automatic tooth brush works like a fountain pen. Within the handle of the brush is a tube for tooth paste. At the end of the handle is a cap which covers the tube. The tube leads to the root of the brush, into which the paste is squeezed out, the mouth working by means of ball bearing which automatically closes after the paste is supplied to the brush and thereby prevents the water from entering the tube.

This device does away with the bother of supplying the brush with tooth paste every time a person brushes his teeth. All he has to do is to feed the paste into the tube at the beginning, just as one puts ink into a fountain pen, and as long as the supply lasts the brush works automatically.

The two-in-one shaving brush works on the same principle.

According to Kiyota, negotiations are now under way with a manufacturer in Japan to produce the automatic tooth brush and two-in-one shaving brush.

TRAFFIC LIGHTS

The direction lights work by means of a device installed on the dashboard which controls a set of three lights set up in the front part of the car. There are two red lights and one green one and they are used for the prevention of accidents at street crossings. When the green light is turned on, it means that the car is going straight ahead across the intersection. The two red lights call for either left turn or right turn.

"These lights," Kiyota said, "will be a great boon to motorists in driving at night. While in Japan I was informed that this will save the city of Tokyo approximately 150,000 yen a day. Hand signals are practically of no use at night because people cannot see them. The lights will enable the motorists as well as the pedestrians to see which way the cars are going, and this will be very effective in preventing accidents at street crossings."

FOR RAINY WEATHER

The lights may also be used in the daytime as a means of safeguard against collisions at street intersections. In rainy weather they will be a great boon to a driver, for it does away with the necessity of keeping the window open and putting out his hands to give signals each time he crosses an intersection."

Airplanes, according to Kiyota, will also be benefited by these direction lights. The flashing of the colored lights will tell the pilot which way the oncoming plane is traveling. This will be of tremendous advantage in future years with the growth of air traffic.
