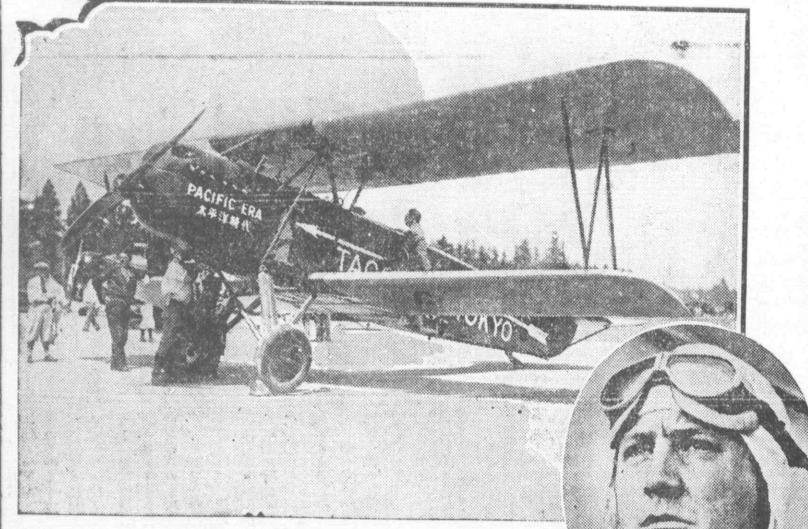

## BIG TYPHOON HITS JAPAN IN 2ND VISIT

### Severe Storms Cause Deaths and Floods in Wide Area

[Special to The Japanese American News] LONDON, Aug. 5.—Two disastrous typhoons, striking a broad path across Central Japan from the Pacific ocean to the Sea of Japan, brought death to 50 persons and caused wide disorder, according to a dispatch to the London Times. At Osaka 10,000 houses were reported flooded, with 3000 buildings standing in water at Tokyo. The crops of Tohoku, on the eastern seaboard of Japan, suffered heavily. The storms are the second devastating disturbance to visit the island empire within a few weeks.

## FARM RELIEF IS WANTED

### Rural Heads Want Tax Reduction, Price Stability

[Special to The Japanese American News] TOKYO, Aug. 5.—The farm leaders of the Minseitō party are beginning to take the present farm situation more seriously as the reports from the prominent members of the opposition party visiting the country districts in group for investigation begin to pour in revealing the tenseness of the situation. However, political observers here are casting frowning looks upon the plans being formulated by the farm leaders of the Minseitō party to be presented at the coming Imperial Diet, as such plans would cause the already-difficult budget formulation much more difficult.
