Mr. Ichikawa is at present a prominent member of the business staff of the Oji Paper Manufacturing company with the Yusen Lines in Tokyo.

"Personally, I do not advise any second-generation Japanese to come to the land of his parents and cultivate his future. Japan may need certain types of young men reared and educated in America, but such demand is limited, and this is especially so at this time when the country is visited by the worst financial depression in years and is flooded with the unemployed intelligent.

"You may from time to time be told of the success in Japan of such and such second-generation members, but remember that there are always exceptions. Persons with exceptional ability and integrity will be welcomed not only in Japan alone but in any society. After all, for the second generation Japanese, America is their country; she is in every way—language, living conditions, social customs, and what not—comfortable for them to live. Set down for them is to settle down in America and look for the future."

Sound advice, we feel from someone who really knows. Time was, not so long ago, when every second generation with any ambition dreamed of going back to the land of their fathers and doing "something great." Then as we grew older, some of us went back to Japan to study, to visit, or to really try our wings there. The result is that the mania for every "Tom, Dick and Harry" to go to Japan to try for success has gradually subsided.

Somehow, it is so easy to imagine that one is an exception and that one will make a success in Japan, or in some far off country which one has never seen. Somehow, it is often hard for us to see that success can be more easily attained right here where we are familiar with the language, customs, and environment—but perhaps that mental attitude is not peculiar to the second generation alone. It may be just a perennial human instinct. It seems that way, anyway.

SEVERE SNOW STORM HITS JAPAN AND COAST REGION

[Special to Japanese American News]
TOKYO, Jan. 10.—A fierce wind and snow storm has been raging from the southern tip of Japan at Kagoshima to the northern point at Hokkaido since last night. The storm is severest on the China Sea and at the Chosen Straits, formerly known as the Genkai Straits.

As a result, the Fusani-Shimonoseki Line has been completely stopped. The Shokel Maru which was to have reached Fusani yesterday at 6 p.m. failed to make port at a late hour last night. It was finally located at an early hour this morning heading for Shimonoseki. According to radio messages, the Shokel Maru had almost reached Fusani but had been driven back by the

storm. All other shipping has been stopped.

The Yamato Maru from Formosa carrying on board Governor General Ishizuka of Formosa succeeded in reaching Shimonoseki but was not able to dock.
