Fresno YML Puts Out Pamphlet of December Confab

FRESNO, Feb. 12.—Fifty organizations in Central California have received mimeographed pamphlets containing records of the transactions and proceedings at the first convention of the League of Young Men's Association of Fresno County, held in December of last year.

The booklet, bound in heavy brown mottled cover with attractive cover design, is written in English and Japanese and contains the resolution that the Y.M.A. extends a vote of gratitude and appreciation to the true pioneers of the first generation.

This followed by introductory remarks by the president, a general report of the conference, and a list of questionnaires by the first and second generations, which reflects the attitudes and desires of both groups.
