

ENGLISH TENNIS CRITICS PRAISE JAPANESE PLAYERS

I. Aoki, Ryuki Miki Make Good London Showing Suma Sugi to Talk on Amendment Bill at Local Church

LONDON, April 6.—Great tributes are being paid by British experts to the sportsmanship and efficiency of the Japanese lawn tennis players now competing in English tournaments.

These appreciations are inspired by the recent important victories of Iwao Aoki and Ryuki Miki, who figured so prominently in the covered court championships of London, Aoki taking titles in the singles (beating Miki in the final), men's doubles and mixed doubles, while Miki shared the honors with his compatriot in the men's doubles title.

Among the tributes is that of H. R. McDonald, one of Britain's premier lawn tennis critics, who declares that all Japanese players possess a wonderfully balanced temperament in a greater degree than the players of any other nation.

McDonald reviews Miki's great feat in winning the South of England championship at Eastbourne last year when the little Japanese beat Britain's star player, Wilfred Austin, H. Keates Lester and Charles H. Kingsley in successive rounds. He also predicts that Miki will be a big factor in the distribution of the present season's honors.

WILL FORM NEW COUNCIL Seattle Citizens Discuss Union of the Northwest

[Special to Japanese American News] SEATTLE, April 6.—The organization of the Northwest District Council will be one of the important questions to be discussed at the coming meeting of the Seattle chapter of the Japanese-American Citizens' league, which will be held on Saturday, April 18.

According to present plans, the Council will be composed of all the Washington chapters and the Portland league. Plans for the coming Northwest Citizens' league convention, to be held later this year, will also be discussed.

The report of the national convention held here last year will soon be published, according to an announcement made by the committee in charge of the publication.

WELCOME TO ROYALTY IS ANNOUNCED

H. I. H. Prince Takamatsu and Bride in L. A. May 11 Great and elaborate preparations are now being made both in Los Angeles and in this city in anticipation of the arrival of Their Imperial Highnesses, the Prince and Princess Takamatsu.

The Imperial couple will arrive in Los Angeles at 12:15 noon on board a Santa Fe train from the Grand Canyon. Consul Satow of Los Angeles will go to San Bernardino to meet the distinguished guests.

YOUNG PEOPLE TO MEET Upon their arrival at the Santa Fe station, Their Imperial Highnesses will be met by the notables of Los Angeles city, both Japanese and American. It is also being planned that second generation members line the streets on the line of the procession of the guests.

A huge dinner party at the Ambassador Hotel on May 17 will be attended by about 1500 Japanese and American residents in honor of the Prince and Princess. It is reported. Reservations are already being made for the dinner.

WILL VISIT FARM On the morning of the 18th, the Prince and Princess will visit Long Beach, Venice, Palms, and inspect Japanese celery farms. Consul Satow will accompany the Imperial party as far as Palms Verdes and the pea ranch, explaining to Their Highnesses the history of the Japanese in America. Luncheon will be held on board the flagship Texas with Commander-in-Chief Admiral Chase as host. On their return, the party will see the oil wells of Signal Hill. The Imperial party will be the guests of Consul Satow, early on the morning of the 20th. There the Prince and Princess and their retinue will rest by the seaside and indulge in golf for a day or two, proceeding towards the north on the 22nd.

A VISIT TO STANFORD On the 22nd they will pay a short visit to Stanford University, arriving at San Francisco in the morning. Consul General Kaname Wakasugi of San Francisco will entertain His Imperial visitors at an unofficial dinner at his residence on the same evening.

Following a tour of the city on the 23rd, the Japanese Consulate General and the Japanese community will combine to tender a reception in the evening.

TO SEE YOSEMITE Their Imperial Highnesses will spend May 24, 25 and 26 in viewing the splendors of Yosemite, to return to San Francisco on the 27th. On that evening the Japan Society is planning a big banquet in honor of the distinguished guests.

The Prince and Princess will sail on the M. S. Chichibu Maru, which leaves this port on May 28.

Oakland Church Baptizes 35 at Easter Services

The royal couple are en route to the United States, where the King will undergo an operation upon a cataract in his eyes. They will continue their journey on the same boat.
