MISS S. SUGI TALKS IN S.F. ON APRIL 13

Mrs. Parker Maddux, Noted Clubwoman, Will Speak

Women leaders of different races but both taking interest in the same question, the Cable Act amendment, affecting the citizenship status of women after marriage to aliens, will speak Monday evening at the Reformed church beginning at 8 p.m. under the auspices of the San Francisco Citizens' league.

The two women are Mrs. Parker Maddux, social leader and prominent clubwoman of this region, and Miss Soma Sugi, active member of the Los Angeles Citizens' league who recently went to Washington to work for the passage of the Cable Act amendment at that time up before Congress.

The Cable Act amendment favorable to second generation girls in that it permits them to retain their citizenship upon marrying men born in Japan, was passed during Miss Sugi's stay in Washington. Miss Sugi will talk on impressions of her visit to the East and of her meetings with the lawmakers of the nation.

Mrs. Maddux, a powerful and charming speaker, will give an outline of the history of women's struggles for equal rights with men in the matter of her citizenship status after marriage. Through the many organizations with which she is connected, Mrs. Maddux has long been active in working for a satisfactory amendment to the Cable Act.

Miss Sugi has already thrilled the audiences of New York and the southland with her speeches and accounts of her recent trip, it is reported.

Before the public meeting at the Reformed church, a sukiyaki dinner is being planned in honor of Mrs. Maddux and Miss Sugi by officers of the local league.

The Japanese community, old and young alike, citizens and non-citizens are being cordially invited to attend the speech meet.

Miss Sugi is arriving in San Francisco at 9:30 a.m. Friday morning.

N. SHIMURA WINS PLACE IN ALL STATE TOURNEY

LOS ANGELES, April 9.—In one of the most bitterly contested singles matches of the day, Fred Shimura, San Francisco star tennis player, went down to defeat in the hands of his opponent R. Kawasaki, in the quarter finals of the annual All-California singles tennis tournament held at the Evergreen courts, April 8.

R. Kawasaki staged a great uphill fight to come from behind and take the match. Three sets were played.

The other singles matches found for the north only one quarter-finalist, Nebo Shimura, who defeated Yasuo Maeno in three sets.

The remaining finalists of the singles tourney are as follows: Kawasaki, Yoshida, Endo, and N. Shimura, of the north.

In the doubles matches, Shimura-Endo defeated Yamate-Shinohara; and Sumida-Fujii defaulted to Yoshida-Kawasaki when Sumida hurt his foot. The score at the point of defaulting was 6-3, 5-3, in favor of Yoshida-Kawasaki.
