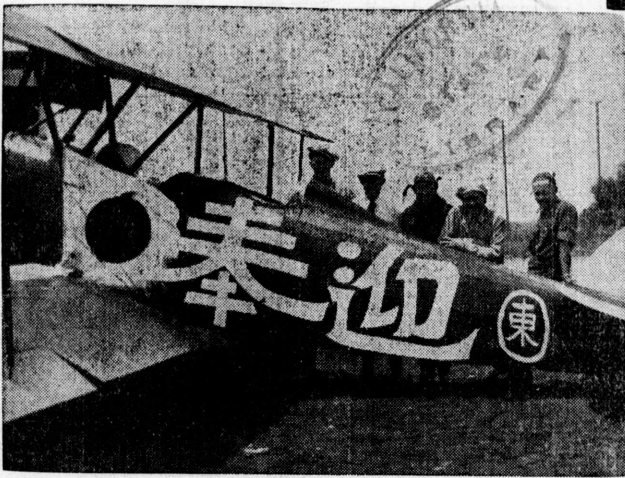

Thousands Cheer 'Banzai' at Departure of Prince and Princess Takamatsu from Southern Metropolis

LOS ANGELES, May 20.—(Special Telephone Message to The Japanese American News)—Responding to the enthusiastic and uproarious cheers and "banzais" that came from the throat of more than 3500 Japanese who lined up at the Southern Pacific station, with sunny smiles the Imperial guests, T. I. H. Prince and Princess Takamatsu, left the southern metropolis for Northern California at 7:45 o'clock this morning.

Officials Greet Imperial Party at Salinas 5 p m Wed.

SALINAS, May 20.—The train, carrying T. I. H. Prince and Princess Takamatsu and their retinue arrived here from Los Angeles 5:01 o'clock this afternoon. They were met by the presidents of the Japanese associations of Salinas, Watsonville, and Monterey.

Immediately after their arrival, the Imperial guests sped down to Del Monte on the automobile sent by Consul General Kaname Wakasugi in San Francisco. They are scheduled to stay at the Hotel Del Monte for two days after which they will leave for San Francisco on May 22.

Prince Takamatsu wore a dark blue suit and grey hat while Princess Takamatsu appeared beautiful in her light grey dress and white hat.

GETS LITTLE EARLIER
 The royal party arrived at the station a little before starting time, where they were met by a great crowd of children, including the entire membership of the Dalchi gaku who missed giving the royal guests a welcome when they arrived here Sunday due to some misunderstanding, and other Japanese who lined up in front of the station.

For about 10 minutes before the departure of the train the Prince and Princess walked around the platform asking many questions concerning the construction of the railway station.

As the special Imperial train was about to depart from the station, Commander Yamagata, master of ceremonies, appeared at the platform and expressed their Imperial Highnesses' gratitude in giving them such a whole-hearted reception and welcome during their stay in Los Angeles.

FRESNO ATTORNEY ANSWERS QUESTIONS ON HOW TO REGAIN U. S. CITIZENSHIP

Following is a brief of an interview just held by Attorney Tom Okawara of Fresno with Mr. William J. Kane, United States Naturalization Examiner at the Fresno County Court-house. With the recent passage of the Cable Act Amendment enabling second generation girls who had married Japanese citizens to regain their citizenships, many young married women are anxious to know ways and means of so doing. As a result of his interview, Mr. Okawara answers many questions concerning the matter in simple language and direct manner in the following timely article—

Q. What is the procedure for the naturalization of American born Japanese women who marry ineligible Japanese aliens?

A. The procedure is the same in the case of any woman who has married an alien, except in the case of any woman who has married an alien, except in the American born woman, no certificate of arrival will be required.

Q. There are Japanese women born in this country who were sent to Japan by their parents and who have recently returned—Is a certificate of arrival necessary in these cases?

A. No. Preliminary applications

should be completed omitting howe-
 ver, the first page and mailed to the District Director of Naturalization, Post Office building, San Francisco. Then applicant will be notified to appear on a certain date at the county court house for the purpose of filing before the examiner the final petition.

Q. Is it necessary for the applicant to appear personally?

A. Yes, the petition must be filed by her personally with the examiner.

Q. What about the witnesses?

A. The witnesses must appear with her. They must be American citizens and must be able to identify the applicant woman sufficiently as the one named in the birth certificate.

Q. What documents should be presented to you?

A. The birth record and marriage license.

Q. Are the witnesses excused after the filing of the petition?

A. No, they must appear in Court at the examination and testify as to her identity.

Q. Must the applicant be able to speak and understand the English language?

A. By all means. Question will be asked her in the English language and she must answer in English. She must have some knowledge of the United States Constitution, American history and about the state and county government.

Q. Will an interpreter be permit-

ted?

A. Absolutely not. Applicant must have a speaking knowledge of the English language. Japanese women should be referred to naturalization classes now being conducted under the school department.

Q. Where are the naturalization classes held?

A. They are held at stated intervals both in the city of Fresno and various towns.

Q. Is residence in the county required before applications may be filed?

A. No. There is no requirement of residence, neither place nor duration. An American born Japanese woman may file her petition on the day of her return to America.

Q. May these petitions be filed in any county?

A. Yes. A resident of Kings county, Kern or Tulare county may file in Fresno county.

The Naturalization department will co-operate in any way with the Japanese applicants to facilitate their naturalization. However, during this session on account of the shortage of examiners, many cases have been continued.

If a sufficient number of Japanese applicants can be prepared in a group for examination, perhaps some way may be devised to take care of them as a group. The Japanese association of Fresno is endeavoring to arrange matters so that this can be accomplished, I am informed.
