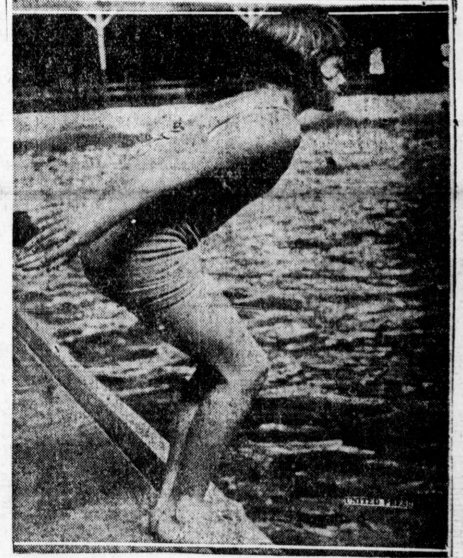

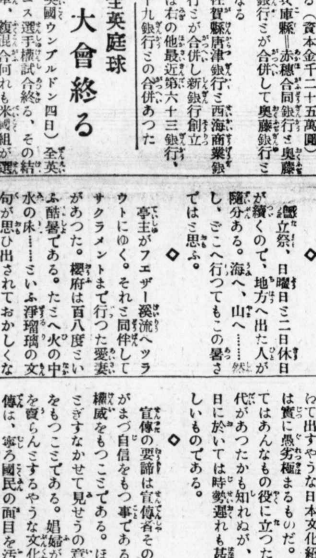

## HOSEI WILL CLASH WITH YAMATO A.C.

### Japan College Team Includes Former Stockton Boy

(Special to Japanese American News) STOCKTON, July 5.—The much-awaited baseball games between the Yamato A. C. nine and the Hosei university team from Japan, will take place at the Yamato ground this coming Wednesday afternoon, July 8, beginning at 2 p.m. The fans of the San Joaquin Valley will have the opportunity to see the last year's inter-collegiate baseball champions of the Far East in action.

Two pitchers who have been carrying the brunt of the pitching burden for the Hosei nine during their U. S. tour are, Suzuki and Wakabayashi. Suzuki is considered about the best pitcher in Japanese collegiate circles, while Wakabayashi, former Yamato player, is noted for his speed ball delivery and good sweeping curves. The Hoseis are expected to start Wakabayashi against the Yamato, with Suzuki in reserve. Yamato will start out "Babe" Mirikitani, who hold an enviable record of 96 strikeouts in the past eight games, and is considered to possess an arm that can throw fastest ball among the Japanese pitchers, in the state. Tar Shirachi will be in reserve.

When reached for a statement, Manager "Bish" Nakahara said that the boys are in trim and will fight hard to win. He will depend on the batting of "Hack" Okada, and the pitching of Mirikitani. The rest of the lineup is as follows: Nakahara, 1b; P. Hotta, 2b; Miyata, 3b; M. Ito, ss; Tsunekawa, lf; Okino, cf; Ted Mirikitani, rf; Yamasaki, rf; H. Ito, Hirose, Horita, utility.

In the evening the Yamatomen will entertain the Hosei squad at the Minato-Zushi, where Dr. Akimoto of the local club will present a trophy and also preside as toastmaster for the evening.

## BIDS FOR CHURCH EDIFICE IN L. A. TO BE OPEN TODAY

### Request of City Councilman to Refuse Building Permit to Episcopal Church Crushed in Court

(Special to Japanese American News) LOS ANGELES, July 5.—The writ of mandamus presented by the officials of the Japanese Episcopal church here to the City Building department, following the victory of the Japanese in Superior Judge Gates' court, and bids for the contract of the construction of the church on Mariposa and 10th streets are slated to be opened Monday or Tuesday.

A request was presented recently by Council Burns of the Pico Heights district to the city council to refuse granting of a permit to the Japanese to build a religious edifice in his district. It was, however, vigorously opposed by City Attorney Werner who upheld that no such restrictions existed in the Pico Heights district.

The hearing of the case of the defendant, Councilman Burns, will be held on July 10, but City Attorney Werner assured the Japanese that the decision on the case already given will not be changed.

## Tokyo Doctors Attack Birth Control Policy

TOKYO, July 3.—(U.P.)—Tokyo physicians, members of the Association of Graduate Medical Practitioners, have decided to oppose the birth control movement, and shortly will present a memorial to the government to that effect, according to the vernacular press.

Before any national policy with regard to the birth rate—which increases to such an extent that many observers believe the empire within a few years will be unable to support its increasing population—is adopted the physicians believe the question should be studied carefully and statistics collected showing the influence of birth control on eugenics and social conditions.

Birth control clinics already are operated by social welfare bureaus in the larger cities of Japan.
