By K. K. ARE THE second generation Japanese good Americans, or are they hyphenated? Figures released recently by the local consulate-general and published in yesterday's issue of the paper shed some light on the subject.

According to these figures, there are within the area under the jurisdiction of the San Francisco consulate-general some 15,174 American-born Japanese who retain both their Japanese and American citizenships, while there are 14,216 who possess only American citizenship.

LOS ANGELES, July 20.—A barn dance was held Friday, July 17, by the Oxy "Y" club, in the Japanese Y.M.C.A. hall which was decorated to appear like the interior of a barn.

THE FACT OF dual citizenship

which was made so much of in the past bore no significance in view of a legal accident entirely out of control of those who were affected by it. In international law, it was called the conflict of the principle of jus sanguinis and the principle of jus soli. Translated into plain English, it means that American law provided that all those born on American territory were American citizens regardless of parentage and at the same time all children born on foreign soil of parents possessing American citizenship were also American citizens.

Now, Japan did have until recently a law similar to that of the United States, stating that all children born of Japanese parents were subjects of Japan regardless of where they were born. Hence, theoretically, every American-born Japanese automatically possessed dual citizenship, although even in olden times, many Japanese parents bestowed only American citizenship on their children through the simple expedient of hiding from the Japanese authorities the fact that any child had been born to them, while reporting the birth to the American authorities. But in 1924, the Japanese government, in an act of extreme liberality compared with the attitude of most of the countries which were troubled with this problem, so changed its laws that children born of Japanese parents in countries which granted automatic citizenship at birth would no longer receive Japanese citizenship. It also went further and provided that those who already possessed dual citizenship could get rid of their Japanese citizenship by filing an application for expatriation.

THE extent to which American-born Japanese have availed themselves of this privilege of expatriation can be seen in the comparison between the figures of five years ago and the figures of this year. Even in face of the many discriminations which American society sets up against them, and even though their own parents are denied the right of naturalization, American-born Japanese have overwhelmingly and voluntarily cast their lot with the land of their birth. In view of these facts, can anyone question the loyalty of the American citizens of Japanese extraction?

And are these facts at all startling in view of the fact that in spite of discrimination and social disadvantages, these American-born Japanese have been entirely educated in American schools, have been nurtured and developed in the cultural environment of America, while most of them have never even seen Japan, much less imbibed any great influence from her. And all this is quite as it should be.

Johnson, formerly federal tax collector in San Jose, went on trial before Judge Loderback of the U. S. District Court in San Francisco Tuesday morning.

Count Hirofuro Hayashi, president of the Imperial Educational association of Japan, who arrived in San Francisco last Wednesday on his way to attend the International Educational convention in Denver, left the city Tuesday morning after making various side-trips to places of interest in this locality, including a trip to Yosemite.

JURY DISAGREES
