## SERIOUS SITUATION IS REVEALED IN MANCHURIA WITH TROOP MOVEMENTS

### Japanese Forces Going Toward Russian Territory In The North Arouses Soviet Suspicion

TOKYO, Oct. 31.—A movement of the Japanese troops northward from Manchuria toward Russian territory is impending, according to a Nippon dispatch received here today from Mukden.

While Japan apparently was preparing to enforce its "friendly warning" to Russia, it was understood that the Chinese military commanders in Heilungkiang province were strengthening their forces with evident intentions of defending their stronghold.

## GAS BOMBS GREET MOB IN BUSINESS DISTRICT SOUTHERN METROPOLIS

### Los Angeles Business District Thrown Into Uproar When Crowd Attacks Auditorium

LOS ANGELES, Oct. 31.—Police tossed 125 tear bombs and threw the business district into turmoil while battling a crowd of 500 men and women who sought to hold a mass meeting in the Philharmonic Auditorium last night.

The trouble started when a crowd gathered with the intention of holding a meeting in the Philharmonic building. Police refused to permit the meeting. They said it had been arranged by Communists. The crowd pushed the building when the police repulsed several women who tried to force their way in. In the melee three policemen were slugged with blackjacks. Clubs and fists were used.

## EVERY SIGN NOW POINTS TO IMPROVED CONDITION SAY AS PRESIDENT HOOVER

### Price Advancement, Return of Hoarded Money to Banks, Among Other Important Matters
