

MANCHURIAN INDEPENDENT ARMY DEFEATED, LEADERS REPORTED TO BE EXECUTED

Regular Chinese Forces Overcome Troops Seeking To Set Up New Manchu Government in North

TOKIO, Nov. 3.—Forces under Gen. Chang Hsueh-Liang, Manchurian dictator, defeated the Independent army of Gen. Ling Yin-Ching near Chinchon today, marking the first victory over the revolutionary forces.

It was reported that Gen. Ling, who was endeavoring to establish an independent government in the Northeastern Province, with his "peoples army" was captured and executed.

NEW CLASHES ARE FEARED THE NORTH

Chinese Do Not Comply With Demand For Repairs

TOKIO, Nov. 3.—Renewed clashes in Manchuria were believed imminent today when the Chinese officials failed to comply with a Japanese ultimatum demanding repairs to a bridge over the Monni River.

Japanese leaders decided to have the bridge repaired themselves when the time limit set by the ultimatum expired without action by Gen. provisional government.

The ultimatum carried a veiled threat of reprisals in event the Chinese failed to make the repairs, and it was believed that clashes were possible.

To Honor Elders On Pioneer Day

FRESNO, Nov. 3.—Pioneer Day will be celebrated next Sunday, November 8, by the Central California YWBA League when it entertains 113 elderly Japanese people of Central California past the age of 60.

The purpose is to pay respect and reverence to the elder folk.

SOVIET WANTS PEACE

GENEVA, Nov. 3.—Soviet Russia was on record today as demanding a "binding" international treaty to force a world wide arms truce.

Accepting the League of Nations assembly projects for a one year truce, ratified by 37 states out of 63, the Soviet foreign commissar, Maxim Litvinoff, made reservations against accepting of a "gentlemen's agreement" not to arm.

TOKIO, Nov. 3.—A mounting casualty list was feared today as meager details of a severe earthquake on Kyushu and Shikoku islands reached Tokyo over repaired communication lines.

What Causes Quakes Is Shown By Science

There have been numerous theories advanced to explain the earthquakes which recur throughout the world, but one of the most interesting, and apparently the most probable, is that the shrinkage of the interior of the earth as it cools, causes a readjustment of the earth's crust.

It is the belief that in the early life of the earth, a tremendous mass of matter was thrown out from where the Pacific ocean now is and that that mass of matter became the moon. This created an immense deep in the Pacific.

Matter in revolution tends to assume a uniform surface, and there was a force exerted to pull the land masses towards the great deep in the Pacific, with the result that four great faults developed in the crust of the earth.

There remains even now one of the great deeps in the Pacific off the eastern coast of the Japanese islands, and the pull of the earth to fill that deep continues to cause quakes throughout the islands.

GREAT IMPROVEMENTS IN BUSINESS SEEN AS FARM PRICES ADVANCE

Middle West Is Enthusiastic Over Outlook When Wheat, Oil and Other Products Move Up In World Markets

Rising wheat prices were acclaimed almost hysterically by an entire nation today as a forerunner of cash for the farmer to buy goods manufactured and transported by the laborers—a forerunner of work for the jobless.

Washington—Carl Williams, a member of the federal farm board, announced rising wheat prices are "entirely justified," that agriculture was building a foundation for return of prosperity. World wheat supply reported lower than first figured.

Chicago—Grain stored by farmers and hardly worth transportation charges a month ago being loaded for market on strength of prices that have risen 19 cents a bushel. Carloading increase is predicted.

Upon the agricultural situation, Bailey believes depends the business situation of the nation.

New York—Arthur W. Cutten, whose wheat corner in 1925 made him \$15,000,000 reported back in the market, buying since August and reported as predicting dollar wheat.
