(1931 Copyright by United Press) TIENSIN, China, Nov. 9.—Japanese troops bombarded Chinese districts of Tiensin at dawn today after a night of rioting, during which American troops were called to patrol American districts.

U. C. TO HAVE BUILDING TO HELP SPORTS Bids Opened for Million Dollar Gym At Berkeley

BERKELEY, Nov. 9.—Bids for the University of California's new million dollar gymnasium on the Berkeley campus were opened Saturday morning in the office of the comptroller, California hall.

These bids include general construction, heating, ventilating, electric work and plumbing. The building will be of reinforced concrete construction, two and one-half stories in height, and some 512 feet long by 220 feet wide.

Will Have Two Pools The ground floor will include two outdoor swimming pools, one 60 by 100 feet, and the other 45 by 75 feet.

There will be two shooting galleries for military and naval training units, one 50 by 94 feet, and the other 30 by 60 feet.

Adjoining the shooting galleries will be various military and naval training laboratories for ordnance, motors, anti-aircraft, fire control, chronograph, etc., and an armory and exhibit room, work shop, clerical office, and nautical science office.

The main gymnasium or auditorium will also be on this floor. It will have an area of 188 by 138 feet. In addition to these facilities there will be executive offices for the supervisors of boxing, tennis, field sports, intermural sports, etc.

There will be a band room, class rooms, and more therapy rooms. Military and naval science will also have a laboratory and ten offices on this floor.

The mezzanine floor will be taken up by the balcony for central auditorium and basketball pavilion. The balcony will seat about 7500 people. Fan rooms for ventilation will be located on this floor.

Kiyowans Have Hop Plan For December

(Special to Japanese American News) MT. VIEW, Nov. 9.—Plans are rapidly taking shape for the monstrous dance which the local Kiyowans are giving on December fifth.

Rumors Arouse Russ To Fear Danger To Chinese Eastern R. R.

MOSCOW, Nov. 9.—Unconfirmed rumors are being spread from the east today of a purported plot to seize the Chinese Eastern railway in Manchuria—jointly owned by Russia and China—to draw the Soviet Union into the conflict.

The reports were not official and not accompanied by proof, but because of the tension, they were sufficient to arouse fear among Soviet officials that some provocative action might occur along the Chinese Eastern.

Anti-Soviet Plan Reported The story reaching here from Kharbarovsk on the Manchurian border, was that a member of the Japanese mission in Harbin on November 4 negotiated with the white Russian leader, Gen. Kozmin, to investigate a white guard seizure of the Chinese Eastern.

The aforementioned Japanese, the report said, invited Kozmin to organize an anti-Soviet plot, Japan to supply the necessary money, arms and munitions. The white guards would seize the Soviet consulate, the Chinese Eastern headquarters and machine shops, the Far Eastern Bank, and other Soviet institutions and arrest Soviet employees, beginning with the consul and director of the Chinese Eastern.

Showa Juniors Win Over Strauss Team

The smooth working attack of the Showa Juniors swept over the Nathan Strauss grid team Sunday at Golden Gate Park to the tune of 25-0 victory. The little Showans elected to receive and on the second play, Suzuki the fleet-footed half, broke away and dashed 40 yards down the field for the first touchdown.

(Special to Japanese American News) ALAMEDA, Nov. 9.—The powerful Alameda grid machine steam rolled the crippled Berkeley Nissei eleven in their game Sunday at the A. T. K. field, 2516. It seems that the game was cancelled but finally it was decided to play, much to the satisfaction of 500 odd fans who were on hand to view the fracas.

George Miki, the Mudhen quarterback sparked his team in brilliant fashion, ably assisted and abetted by Nogami, fullback, to outclass the visitors. An excuse can be offered for the Nisseis in that their full strength could not be presented due to unavoidable absences, but nevertheless Miki and company must be given credit for their performance.

Nakayama Scores Scarcely had the fans settled back after the kickoff than they were brought to their feet by Miki's bullet pass to Tanaka, end, which netted the Mudhens their initial touchdown. This score seemed to have the effect of a tonic on the Nissei boys for they came back strong.

In the second quarter with the two Nakayama brothers plunging through the Alameda forward wall for constant gains, the Berkeley team wound up a long march up the field with Hide Nakayama bucking the ball across the final marker for their only points.

STIMSON PLANS NEW MOVE FOR PEACE IN TROUBLED FAR EAST

Secrecy Preserved Regarding Plans Formed After Consultation With President Hoover

(By United Press) WASHINGTON, Nov. 9.—Secretary of State Stimson is planning a new American move to maintain peace in the Orient. This was learned today after Stimson held a conference with President Hoover at the White House. Officials would not disclose the nature of the projected step.

Because he is actively working on this latest effort to safeguard peace, Stimson declined at his press conference today to discuss the Manchurian situation. He would not answer directly a question as to whether American forces in China would be supplemented because of anti-foreign demonstrations. Stimson said that many things were under consideration.

Squadron Is Near He pointed out, however, that a squadron of naval vessels is already in the Far East as well as a regiment of infantry in Tientsin. In China would be supplemented because of anti-foreign demonstrations. Stimson said that many things were under consideration.

Although Stimson regards the present phase of the Chinese Japanese struggle as very serious, it was understood he has not lost hope of preventing open warfare between China and Japan.

There appeared to be at least three courses open to Stimson now in his efforts to prevent war. One would be to renew diplomatic pressure on Tokio and Nanking by sending a strongly worded memorandum urging the two countries to preserve peace. He has sent several such messages in the past.

May Call Conference Second, Stimson might call a conference of the signatories of the nine-power pact of 1922, which provides for consultation if China's territorial integrity is menaced. Thus far officials have taken the view that this step was needless.

California Voters Neglect Opportunity

(Special to Japanese American News) SACRAMENTO, Nov. 9.—Figures made public today by Charles J. Hagerty, state election statistician, reveal that only one man out of every three persons of voting age in California go to the polls on election day.

Federal census reports show that there are 3,864,388 persons of voting age in California. Only 1,444,872 votes were cast at the general state election in November 1930. This was the largest vote ever recorded in California.

The registration totaled in 1930 2,245,228, which shows, says Hagerty that thousands of citizens neither register nor vote. Of the 3,800,000 persons of voting age in the state, 2,025,774 are men and 1,836,614 are women.

"Of course," says Hagerty, "all those of voting age are not eligible to cast a ballot, but most of them are. Of the 3,864,388 of voting age only 224,812 are aliens and 33,048 do not have their citizenship reported."
