## CHIANG, KOO, SOONG QUIT CHINA POSTS

### Lin Sen Takes Over Post As Acting President

NANKING, China, Dec. 15.—(UPI)—(11:50 p.m.)—The disintegration of the Nanking National government proceeded rapidly tonight, while riotous students held sway in the capital.

The resignation of Chiang Kai-Shek as head of the government was followed tonight by the resignations of T. V. Soong as finance minister, and Wellington Koo as foreign minister. Chiang Kai-Shek proceeded to fortify a villa at Tangshawan, a resort near Nanking.

## BEARS HOLD SAC'TO 6-6

### Senator's Man Takai Makes Featured Gallop

LODI, Dec. 15—Playing in a drizzling rain, the hard fighting Bears of the Tokay city tied the highly touted Taiku Senators here Sunday by the score of 6-6 by virtue of a last quarter touchdown.

In the second quarter, "Light-horse" Yulene Takai caught Okazaki's spiral on his own 10 yard marker, dodged two tacklers, and for a time it looked as if he was off; but Matsuo Okazaki laid him low with a flying tackle from behind on Lodi's 15 yard line. A few minutes before the end of the half, the Taiku worked the ball over. Their try for point failed.

Okazaki Bucks

Late in the last quarter, Lodi, resorting to passes, completed two toises in rapid succession. The last heave, from Matsuo Okazaki to Tanaka, was good for a 20 yard gain, Tanaka being brought down on the enemy 7 yard stripe. Okazaki took the ball and crashed into the line three times, but on the fourth time he found a hole and wormed his way over the Sacramento goal.

Kitazumi, the Senator, guard, played a great game, breaking up many of the Lodi plays before they started. In the backfield, Morimitsu, Takai, and Noda turned some nice gains.

Sato Stars

"Hank" Sato, Lodi pivot man, broke through the Capital forwards, spilling the Sacramento backs time and time again. Usui and Tanka played strong defensive games. Okazaki performed in his usual brilliant style, being the key man of the Lodi offense. The Lodi lineup follows: Tanaka, Hayashi, "Tak" Kishida, ends, Usui, S. Kishida, tackles, "Tad" Kishida, N. Kishida, guards; Sato, center; Matsuo, Okazaki, quarter; Matsuhiko, T. Okazaki, half; S. Funamura, fullback.

## JAPAN TO SEND OVER 100 ATHLETES TO L. A. OLYMPIC

TOKYO, Dec. 14.—The government subsidy for the Japanese delegation to the 10th World Olympic games in 1932 at Los Angeles will amount to 70,000 yen, it was decided recently at a budget meeting held in the Prime minister's official residence.

This means a drastic cut in the original figure of 300,000 yen.

Even with additional private contributions, sponsors would find difficulty in sending 100 athletes to the games under present figures, it is believed here.

The Tokyo Varsity league, composed of the six big universities of this

city, has promised the Japan Athletic association to subscribe a sum equal to the government subsidy.

This contribution, plus donations from the public, raising the figure to some 160,000 yen, will greatly augment the fund. Although 180 athletic delegates could not be sent with this sum, there is a likelihood that more than 100 will be dispatched.

The original plan for the Japanese delegation consisted of the following number of athletes: Track and field, 45. Aquatic sports, 40. Rowing, 23. Skiing, 12. Skating, 10. Equestrianism, 8. Hockey, 17. Boxing, 10.

### G. Suzuki's Choice Shows Considerable Thought

(Special to Japanese American News) TOKYO, Dec. 15.—Foreign minister, Tsuyoshi Inukai, who is also Japan's Prime minister, today instructed the Foreign office to cable Ambassador Kenchiku Yoshizawa for his immediate return from Paris via Siberia.

Upon his return to Tokyo, Ambassador Yoshizawa will be appointed Foreign minister by Inukai, his father-in-law, who will accompany him to the Palace at once for installation into the office in the presence of His Majesty the Emperor.

Naotake Sato, ambassador to Belgium, is expected to take the place of Yoshizawa as ambassador to Paris. Sato left Brussels this morning for Geneva as Japan's chief delegate to the disarmament conference.

Chiang Quits

NANKING, China, Dec. 15.—(UPI)—Gen. Chiang Kai-Shek head of the Chinese National government and "Christian" commander of the army, navy and air forces, resigned today.

Lin Sen, chairman of the legislative yuan of the National government, assumed the acting presidency.

Martial law was proclaimed in the vicinity of the Japanese consulate general to quell student riots that followed announcement of Chiang's resignation.

Students Wreck Office

The students wrecked the foreign office and broke up a meeting of government leaders.

It was believed that martial law would be applied to other sections of the city unless the 80,000 students from all parts of China were definitely quieted.
