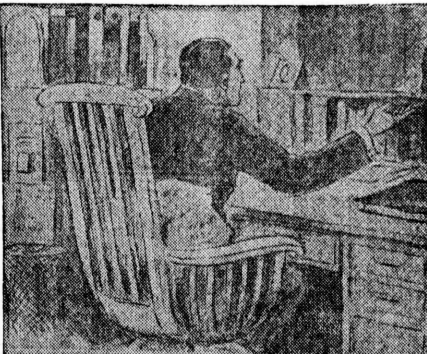

CRAZED MAN KILLS CHILD, INJURES WIFE

Kobayashi Held for Murder by L. A. Police

(Special to Japanese American News) LOS ANGELES, Jan. 19.—N. Kobayashi, Japanese gardener, was held today for the slaying of his 6 months old son, Frank, his mind suddenly became unbalanced due to a prolonged illness.

Kobayashi yesterday decapitated the baby, wounded his two year old daughter and attempted to stab his wife. He collapsed when overpowered by neighbors.

After nursing the child, at their home, 1247 North Commonwealth street, Mrs. Kobayashi, 32, left for a garden patch nearby. The father of the child, Nisuke Kobayashi, 46, killed the child in the buggy and called his other two children, Chiyoko, 5, and Makoto, 2 years, 3 months.

The mother, suspecting something, followed in through the back door, and found her husband in a rage, raising a butcher knife to strike Makoto.

The mother rushed in to take the weapon away, receiving lacerations. She pinned the husband against the wall, while Chiyoko called for help. The neighbors rushed to her assistance.

1500 CHINESE ARE BEATEN BY JAPANESE

Big Casualties Are Inflicted Upon Both Sides

(Special to Japanese American News) TOKYO, Jan. 19 (UP)—Japanese troops defeated 1500 Chinese irregulars today at Diuchuang in one of the heaviest engagements in recent Manchurian fighting, advices received here said.

It was also reported that Japanese had defeated 400 Chinese and occupied the walled city of Wutangpo, five miles north of Tangshangpo on the Mukden Antung railroad.

Both sides are reported to have suffered extensive casualties.

L. A. CITIZENS WILL AID IN LAW CHANGE

Will Exert Pressure To Permit Entry Of Wives

LOS ANGELES, Jan. 19.—In a pre-meeting statement, President Iwanaga of the local Citizens league declared that the citizens should bring pressure to bear on the lawmakers to correct certain evils existing in the immigration laws.

Among legislation which needs correction is the Bill H. R. 304, now pending in the House of Representatives at Washington. At present only the Chinese wives of American citizens are admitted to the United States on non-quota status. The bill H. R. 304 introduced by Congressman Houston endeavors to rectify this and to make it applicable to the wives of all American citizens.

Has Hopes Houston said: "I have every reason to hope that my bill may receive favorable consideration." and further states he is willing to support on the Bill 4678.

The bill H. R. 4675 introduced by Congressman Dyer intends to admit the wives of American citizens on non-quota status even though ineligible to citizenship.

Says Senator Tydings, who introduced another humanitarian bill "I believe my bill 991 is in the interest of common humanity and I truly think the restrictions of our immigration laws should be modified so as to permit unmarried minor children or the wife or the widowed mother of a citizen of the United States to enter this country so that divided families may be reunited."

Monday Meeting The bill in the Senate aims to make better American families of its citizens by endeavoring to unite all members of the family of American citizens.

In the meeting here Monday by the local chapter, these measures were brought to the members attention and steps to awaken the other chapters were discussed.
