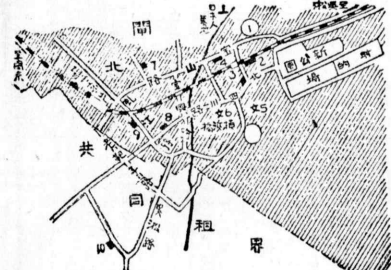

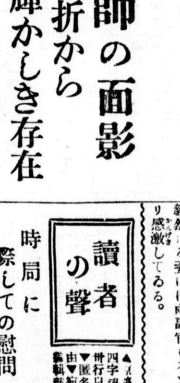

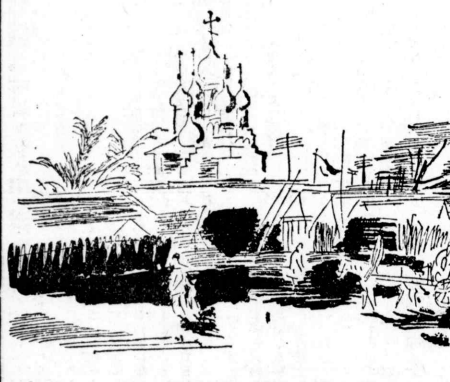

NIPPON TROOPS CAPTURE KIANGWAN AFTER BITTER HAND TO HAND FIGHTING

Big Guns, Air Bombs, Tanks Are Used in New Offense

SHANGHAI, Feb. 20 (AP)—A reinforced brigade of Japanese troops recaptured the village of Kiangwan after bitter hand-to-hand fighting, following the opening of the big push by Japanese troops, fighting with big guns, air bombs, tanks, often battling at close quarters. Buildings were set afire over the entire Kiangwan area by heavy artillery shelling preceding the attack. Victory Cuts Foes in Two Capture of Kiangwan by the Japanese apparently cuts the Chinese first line and may enable the Japanese to consolidate their position, and then attack the separate elements of the Chinese in turn, instead of being compelled to fight along the entire line. Chinese reports claimed that four Japanese tanks had been blown up and two air planes had been shot down over Chapel, where fresh Chinese troops had brought in anti-aircraft guns. Clear Weather Aids Japanese Clear weather aided Japanese air planes Naval and military planes rained their bombs at all points of Chinese concentration from Wooming to Shanghai. The Chinese had not sent up any planes, but were understood to have an air force ready. Chenju, headquarters of the Chinese command was bombed. The Radio Corp. wireless station is there, 70,000 on field. The stubbornness of the Chinese resistance led observers to believe that the fighting would be prolonged. Japanese strength is estimated at 25,000 and Chinese at 70,000 to 100,000. The Japanese claim the Chinese had begun a general retreat. Shortly thereafter the extra Japanese troops were sent in to help the surrounded brigade. Smoke Screen Covers Advance Japanese laid down smoke screens to cover their advance toward Kiangwan. Fire was spreading through the area. Gases from the fires mixed with the smoke screen to darken the entire district. Population in Panic The Chinese population of Shanghai was in panic. Every outgoing steamer was packed with civilians. Ships of all sizes advanced their sailing dates to accommodate refugees.

COURT FIAT AIDS NEWS' CREDITORS

Friends of Nichibei Win Victory at Hearing

Plans for protecting the interest of the creditors won a sweeping victory Saturday when Judge Kerrigan in the United States district court overruled the protest invoked by J. Koike, S. Yamagata and twenty-one others to restrain George M. Naus, receiver in bankruptcy, from offering the Japanese American News for sale in public auction. The judgment was a climax to the prolonged fight by the friends of the newspaper to execute the sale to L. Zellerbach, who is the principle creditor, to be followed in turn by transfer of the property to the Japanese American News corporation, a \$150,000 firm incorporated under the laws of California. Under this plan the creditors would receive stocks in the new corporation in lieu of their obligations, thus protecting their interests as well as that of the Japanese American News, the largest and most influential Japanese daily on the Pacific coast. Judge Kerrigan's pronouncement retains intact the original instructions to the receiver to dispose of the estate at public auction. Phillip S. Ehrlic presented the argument in behalf of Zellerbach, and W. C. Webb attorney for the Yokohama Specie bank, represented the Koike-Yamagata group. The obstructionist method employed by the protesting group at Saturday's hearing would result in heavy losses to the creditors as it would not satisfy the outstanding claims at their full value.
