ASIA WAR TO BE AIRED AT PEACE MEET

Wakasugi, Kwong will Address Parley in Berkeley Mar. 5

(Special to Japanese American News) BERKELEY, Feb. 25—Two notable addresses, presenting the two sides of the controversy in the present Sino-Japanese war in Shanghai, will be delivered on Saturday, March 5, before the California state convention of Women's International League for Peace and Freedom, convening in this city.

At 11:30 Consul General Wakasugi of Japan will speak on "How to Settle the Chinese-Japanese Conflict," at the Hotel Durant, convention headquarters.

At 3 p m in Unity hall, Dana and Bancroft, V. Kwong Lee Kwong, official representative of Y. S. Wong, Chinese consul general, will give "The Chinese Viewpoint of the Chinese-Japanese Conflict."

At 6:30 the convention banquet will be held at the International house.

Ex-Emperor to Head Manchuria Republic

MUKDEN, Feb. 25—The northern executive committee of the new Manchurian state announced today it would be nominally a republic for the time being with Henry Pu-yi, former emperor of China, as provisional executive.

The constitution, following the Nanking model, provides for three councils, known as a legislative yuan, a national affairs yuan and an inspection yuan.

The outline of the constitution failed to mention how the people should participate in the government beyond providing that the chief executive should be nominated by and be responsible to the people.

2000 CHINESE SHOT DOWN BY JAPANESE

Nippon Hurls Attack Villages Captured Near Kiangwan

By H. R. EKINS Written for the United Press

SHANGHAI, Feb. 25—The Chinese and Japanese armies were locked in a death struggle north of Shanghai tonight after a day of terrific fighting in which the Chinese casualties were estimated at 2000.

The fighting was in the triangle formed by the Shanghai North station and the railway running to Woosung.

Chinese Mowed Down The Chinese were literally mowed down by the withering fire of artillery and machine guns and aerial bombs.

Lieut. Gen. Uyeda claimed continued successes and the capture of villages west of Kiangwan in the direction of Tazung.

The Chinese clung desperately to their defenses despite the rain of artillery fire and aerial bombs, capturing the Chinchian sector, less than two miles northwest of Kiangwan.

Win On Two Mile Front From this foothold the Japanese started an attack on the Chienkouchi, Houkouchi and Yanchiajao sectors.

At 2:30 p m Gen. Uyeda issued a communique claiming his forces had captured Houkouchi with a victory over the Chinese on a two mile front and were attacking Yenchia.

Line Broken, Reformers The casualties in today's fighting were almost equal to the announced casualties reported during all previous operations.

From an observation tower near Kiangwan race course the foreign attaches saw 3000 Chinese troops concentrating against the Japanese forces.

The Japanese artillerymen, who had advanced a short time before, got an accurate range and literally mowed down the Chinese.

Gen. Ma is Murdered Says Nanking Report

NANKING, Feb. 25—A Reuters British News agency, dispatch from Harbin, said that General Ma Chan Shan had been assassinated.

General Ma was the defender of Taitshar against the Japanese offensive late last year, and his forces were routed only after severe fighting.

Later, however, his ardor for the Chinese cause cooled, and only last week he participated in conferences sponsored by the Japanese to form an independent Manchuria.

Yesterday's dispatches said he had been inaugurated governor of Heilungkiang province, of which Taitshar is the capital.
