Solon Charges U.S. Shipping 5000 Tons of Nitrate to Japan

STOCKTON, Mar. 14—Representative Fish, republican of N. Y., said large shipments of nitrates to Japan, a chief ingredient of high explosives, were making the United States peace efforts a gigantic farce and sheer hypocrisy.

The New Yorker, sponsor of a proposal to carry out the Kellogg-Briand pact through a multi-lateral agreement to prohibit the shipment of munitions to the foreign nations added:

"A total of 5000 tons of nitrate of soda, the main ingredient of T. N. T., in the making of high explosives, which the Japanese army uses to blast the Chinese out of Manchuria and Shanghai and make China safe for the Japanese, was shipped from Newark News, between January 17 and Feb. 23.
