BOYS CARRY TOY SWORDS, CHINESE IRED

Yee Appeals for Aid As Japanese Wave Cap Pistols

(Special to Japanese American News) SACRAMENTO, Apr. 4—A demonstration by a large group of Japanese boys, armed with wooden swords, cap pistols and B. B. guns, in front of the Chinese Republic school at 522 M st. Friday night resulted in Yee Kim Po, principal of the institution, appealing to the police Saturday.

20 Japanese boys The school principal said the Japanese boys, approximately twenty in number and ranging in age from 10 to 15 years, gathered in front of the school shortly after 8 p. m. Friday and shouted threats against the Chinese pupils.

K. W. Chan, a teacher in the school, expressed fear that another demonstration similar to Friday night's would result in a serious fight between his Chinese pupils and the Japanese boys. He said he had difficulty in restraining the Chinese boys Friday night.

Chan ordered the Japanese boys away from the school, and they left without molesting any of the Chinese pupils.

The Japanese boys are accused by Chan of having gesticulated the toy swords and guns in a threatening manner. Their outbursts against the Chinese were uttered in the Japanese language, although Chan says the boys attend the public schools in Sacramento.
