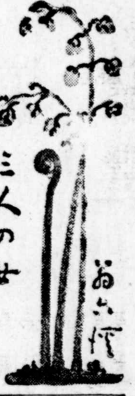

JAPAN QUOTA STILL ISSUE AVERS TAFT

Immigration Problem Is Discussed In New Book

Although obscured by more dramatic incidents of Manchuria and Shanghai, the immigration issue between the United States and Japan continues a principal menace to international amity in the Far East, according to Henry W. Taft, publicist and authority upon American policy in the Orient.

The acuteness of the current Sino-Japanese controversy has postponed developing efforts to heal the sore left by the Immigration Act of 1924, he says in "JAPAN AND AMERICA," issued today by the Macmillan Company; but Taft has no doubt that the movement will be revived.

Congress May Re-Consider "One day," he says, "Congress will probably remove the statutory evidence that, like the human beings of which it is composed, it may, for a fancied affront to its dignity in an unimportant matter, forget ultimate results of far greater significance."

The "fancied affront" to senatorial dignity was embodied, according to Taft, in the famous note of Ambassador Hanihara in 1924 which described the pending immigration bill as a serious menace to mutual good relations. Some senators promptly read it as a threat and announced that it had influenced their votes.

Taft frankly is of the opinion that the Senate was guilty of international bad manners in the abrupt abrogation of the Gentlemen's Agreement with Japan in the treaty of 1924. In support of this view he presents much hitherto unpublished history concerning that episode. Proceedings of the Senate in executive session are published for the first time to establish an accurate background for the long-lived diplomatic issue.

"The debates (upon the Immigration Bill) show that the Senate acted upon the assumption that the Agreement was an informal arrangement by the executive branch of the Government and had never received the approval of the Senate," he says. "The contrary seems to be the fact."

Argument Untenable "Whether or not from the juridical standpoint the Agreement for the continuance of the Gentlemen's Agreement was an amendment to the Treaty of 1911, it had at last been implicitly recognized by the Government and had never received the approval of the Senate and, as it had regulated the immigration of laborers without official complaint for sixteen years, it ought not to have been set aside without paying some heed to diplomatic usage between friendly nations....

The argument repeatedly made in the debate concerning the Immigration Act of 1924 that immigration was a domestic question and not suitable for diplomatic arrangement was not historically tenable."
