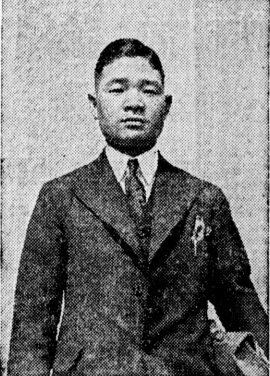

MANY HURT AS KOREAN HURLS BOMB

Gen. Shirakawa Is Listed Among the Wounded

SHANGHAI, Apr. 29.—Four of the highest Japanese officials in Shanghai, including General Yoshinori Shirakawa, commander of the army here and leader of the Japanese forces in the Shanghai fighting, were seriously injured by a bomb explosion here today.

The two most seriously injured were Mamoru Shigemitsu, Japanese minister to China and director of the recent peace parleys here, and Consul General Kuramatsu Mura. Also among the injured was Maj. Gen. Kenkichi Ueda, who began the Shanghai battle as commander, but was replaced by General Shirakawa.

Korean Blamed

The bomb was tossed by an unidentified man believed to be a Korean, into the speakers stand at a big military review in Hongkew Park in honor of the birthday of the Emperor of Japan.

Following the blast the huge crowd closed in on the accused man. Japanese military officers rescued the man, but it was not known immediately whether he was dead or alive.

Japanese marines investigating the attack surrounded the home of W. S. Hibbard, an American employed by the Shanghai Department of Public Works, which has charge of Hongkew Park, where the explosion occurred. Hibbard was understood to be undergoing questioning.

Seven Arrested

Seven men had been arrested, including the park keeper, who was said to be a foreigner. One man was severely beaten by the Japanese crowd. Three of the men were believed to be Koreans.

One of the three, Fimo Kl, 25, was believed to be the actual thrower of the bomb. He was held at Japanese gendarme headquarters.

Rigid martial law was imposed by Japanese military in the vicinity of Hongkew Park and North Szechuan road.

It was believed the gendarme commander would be court-martialed and the resignation of the chief of Japanese consular police was expected.

List of Wounded

The wounded were: Minister Mamoru Shigemitsu, right leg broken; will be incapacitated for months.

Admiral Kichisaburo Nomura, commanding naval forces, wounded in face and eyes; may lose sight.

General Yoshinori Shirakawa, commanding Japanese troops, wounded in the face.

Consul-general Kuramatsu Mura, left leg injured.

General Kenkichi Ueda, who was commander of the 9th division in the Shanghai fighting, left arm injured.

Americans Escape Injury
Lieut. Col. Walter Drysdale, American military attaché, and the British, French and Italian military attaches left the platform only a few seconds before the bomb exploded.

It was believed that important Sino-Japanese peace negotiations to be held in Shanghai would be postponed indefinitely.

YOSHIHARA IS VISITOR HERE

Pacific Flyer Plans Dash to Nippon About May 20

Seiji Yoshihara, accompanied by Retsu Kiyosawa of the Hoochi Shim-bun, arrived here from Los Angeles on the S.P.'s crack train, Lark, Friday morning. He was greeted by a few personal friends.

Looking over the young aviator as he stepped off the train, Yoshihara looks to be anything but an aviator. He sported a derby, placed on his head at a jaunty angle, giving him the appearance of a business man.

Immediately after arriving, Yoshihara was whisked away to the Perry building from the Townsend street station. Going to Alameda, he made preparations to assemble his plane, the Saunders-Roe Amphibian, which has been christened, "Hochi-Nippon."

Plane Arriving Soon
The airplane is arriving via Panama on May 1. He plans to have it assembled at Alameda, or it may have to be done at Oakland.

Yoshihara expressed himself satisfied as to the performance of his plane which he has flown in several test flights already near London, England, before it was sent to America.

Has Speed of 94 Miles
He expects to maintain a cruising speed of about 94 miles per hour. The plane will carry 325 gallons of gasoline which is sufficient to maintain a flight of 18 hours.

The young man will fly from here about May 20. The definite date cannot be determined as yet until the typhoon period in the Orient has passed. The epochal flight will be timed to escape the dangerous period. As soon as favorable weather data has been obtained from the meteorological station at Tokyo, Yoshihara will hop off.

This traditional odyssey, fostered for many years by virtue of indifference in racial make-up and language, has developed between them an ever widening chasm which has caused the people of China proper to regard Manchuria as a foreign state of an alien culture, Dr. Nitobe said.

"On the other hand, Manchuria to Japan has always been, and always will be first line of defense to her national existence," the noted writer declared.

"Japan's orderly administration in the South Manchurian zone has been so productive of results that the population of Manchuria has increased from scarcely 5,000,000 people when the railway rights were acquired in 1906 to 30,000,000 at the present time.

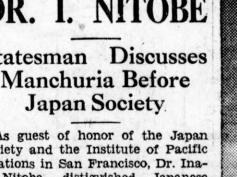
