

NANKING HIT BY WOES OF HARD TIMES

Gov't Lacks Finance, Business Suffers Big Slump

NANKING, May 13—Death-like solitude prevails here, and the city is almost lifeless. Traders are running short of commodities and the government is suffering from the lack of funds.

The Nanking leaders are now holding important conferences daily one-half, but not many people are carrying out.

Not Supplying Cash
Since the Shanghai emergency arose, the Chekiang financial managers are shy of the government and are not supplying funds as they used to.

Besides various military cliques are incessantly asking for remittances. Being obsessed with financial difficulty the government has decreased the ministerial members by half, and cut the pay of the military officers by half and that of the civil officers by two-thirds.

The government has ordered the landlords to reduce house rent by one-half, but not many people are paying the rent.

May Collapse
In visiting places in the city, the scribe saw that Putevraio, which was formerly a thriving quarter is now a desolate one.

The punitive forces in Hunan, Kaingsi, Kuantang and other provinces are draining the national coffers.

It remains to be seen whether the Nanking leaders will be able to ride over the present national crisis.

NYK Boat Here With Notable Guests Aboard

The Taiyo Maru, the first vessel equipped with elevators to go on a trans Pacific run, arrived at 10 o'clock Friday morning from the Orient under the command of Capt. Tomioka.

The Taiyo is bringing a fair list of passengers and a valuable cargo of silk as well as general merchandise.

The Taiyo was formerly a German ship, the Cap Flisener and was bought by the Toyo Kisen Kaisha before it was amalgamated with the Nippon Yusen Kaisha, in 1920.

The arrival of the ship here on her first trip was a great event and thousands of people visited the craft to wonder at her size and magnificence.

Now the Taiyo has given up her throne to the modern motor ships and is in the cabin class, but remains a favorite vessel for old-time travelers and has been accorded the honor of bringing over the Japanese Olympic games athletes on her next east bound voyage.

Among the distinguished passengers aboard the Taiyo was Fumitaka Konoe, the 17 year old son of Prince Fumimaro Konoe, parliamentarian, who is vice president of the House of Peers.

The youthful prince is bound to Lawrenceville academy where he will prepare himself to enter Princeton University.
