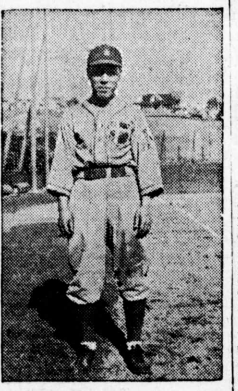
YMCA To Present Wreath for Dollar

Non-Stop Flight From Seattle to Tokyo to Take 50 Hrs.

HOCHI PLANE IS INSURED FOR \$30,000

Trans-Pacific Flight May Be Given Up Says Kiosawa

Seiji Yoshihara's plane, which was almost completely wrecked Monday afternoon when it crashed to earth at the Oakland airport, is covered by \$30,000 insurance with Lloyd's, a British firm, it was revealed Tuesday by Retsu Kiosawa, manager of the flight for the Hichi Shimbun, sponsor.

Kiosawa was uncertain as to whether he would continue with his plans for the trans-Pacific flight.

May Abandon Flight "I wired the Hichi Shimbun immediately after the disaster Monday, and am expecting instructions shortly. It is probable we would have to abandon the flight."

Yoshihara, suffering from crushed right shoulder, right elbow, and right knee, will require six months for recovery, declared the attending physician. The pilot also received injuries on the forehead.

Tel. Oishi suffered a broken rib and crushed right shoulder, as well as bruises about the face and arm. He will recover in three months, the physician said. They are both confined at the Alameda sanitarium.

Oishi is the son of Tokutaro Oishi, proprietor of the United Florists located on Bush st., San Francisco.

INUKAI VALOR IS REVEALED

'Shoot!' Defies Late Premier in Face Of Threat

TOKYO, May 17—Investigations today uncovered details of a solemn Samurai rite that preceded the assassination of Premier Tsuyoshi Inukai, shot to death Sunday night. In the rite like the ancient Samurai warriors offering prayers before going into battle, nine misguided youths worshipped at the Yasukuni shrine and then quietly entering three taxicabs, started for the Premier's official residence.

The nine hurriedly entered the gate five scurried to the back door, while four strode up to the front door and demanded an interview with the Premier.

Premier Courageous Two unarmed police barred the door. One was fatally shot. The other was seriously wounded.

Four of the men rushed inside the house. An old woman servant hearing the firing, and seeing the officers, ran upstairs to the Premier's study. She screamed:

"Run for your life. Desperate officers are coming."

Let Them In The Premier, smiling calmly, replied: "Let them come in. I'll talk to them."

The four entered grimly with revolvers pointed at the aged Premier. Still unflustered, the Premier said quietly:

"Put down your pistols, we can talk this over. Let us go into the library."

Showing not a trace of fear or nervousness, the Premier led the way, the youths following.

At this moment, the five who had come in through the back door, broke in shouting: "Shoot him! Shoot him!"

"Why do you want to shoot me?" the Premier asked. There was no answer.

Finally one of them shouted: "We are going to shoot you." "Bravely, unfortunately, the aged Premier replied: "Shoot then."

Several of them fired. The Premier crumpled with a bullet through his face and into his temple.

The nine young men rushed from the house, jumped into their taxis and sped away.

EX-PREMIER HURLS DEF AT MILITARY

Minseito Chief Says Brute Force Must Be Banned

TOKYO, May 17—A vigorous statement indicating that Japanese political leaders will not blindly submit to domination by military factions was issued here today by Baron Reijiro Wakatsuki, former premier and leader of the Minseito, opposition party.

"The government," said the Baron, "must reject attempts to influence the will of the people by brute force."

Wakatsuki's statement followed by several hours the vital ultimatum by the army council that Japanese political leaders will not blindly submit to domination by military factions was issued here today by Baron Reijiro Wakatsuki, former premier and leader of the Minseito, opposition party.

The ministry must be occupied by a war department leader. His statement was generally interpreted as a political element's answer to the demands of the militarists.

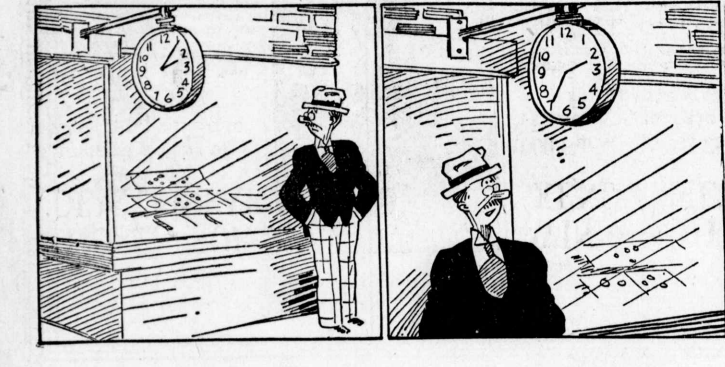
