GIRLS OF S. G. PRAISED BY DEAN OF USC

They Are Intelligent, Alert, Attractive, Says Educator

(Special to Japanese American News) TOKYO, May 19—Miss Mary Sinclair Crawford, dean of women and chairman of the French department of the University of Southern California, thoroughly believes in the second generation Japanese girls as a type of American womanhood, in their alertness, intelligence, and attractiveness.

This was disclosed recently when arriving here on a tour around the world she was interviewed by the Japanese Times, Tokyo's leading English daily.

"Eleanor Glynn's 'I' girl in America is being replaced by a new type of girl," she said. "The modern girl has initiative, poise and independence, which is sometimes trying but nevertheless desirable. She is the finest product of our modern age."

"I thoroughly believe in her, and in giving her full opportunity. This holds true also of our second generation Japanese girl as well as her American sister," Miss Crawford said.

Discussing the second generation American-Japanese in California, Miss Crawford said she was quite proud of them.

Fortunate Group
"We have no more modern girls in America than the American born Japanese girls. She is alert, intelligent and attractive. The American-Japanese are a fortunate group, for they are at home in two different civilizations, and in America where they chose to live, all professions are open to them," she said.

Miss Crawford was asked if there is not a delicate racial barrier against them, even in the university circles.

She was reluctant to discuss this question, as she says she is not quite well informed about it. However, she ventured to state that as far as she knew, there is no delicate barrier against the American-Japanese.

Japanese Not Active
It certainly does not exist in the campus activities, for the Japanese students take active part in athletics and debates without restraint," she declared.

"But is it not true," the writer asked, "that in the university social activities, they are made to understand that they are not welcome? For instance, isn't there a tacit understanding that they are not to participate in class dances?"

Miss Crawford recognized the fact that American-Japanese students are not active in varsity social activities, but she added that she did not attribute their inactivity to racial discrimination.

"It is largely a case of affinity of interests, and selfishness," she replied.
