Prospective Bride Is Given Surprise Festival



PREMIER INUKAI WAS IN DIET FOR 42 YEARS STRAIGHT, ALWAYS ELECTED

The late Premier Tsuyoshi Inukai, who was assassinated Sunday, May 15, became a member of the Japanese Diet in 1890. From that time until his death, he never lost an election at the polls of his native city and remained a Diet member for 42 years. He was never known to miss a committee meeting.

He became premier for the first time last December. On January 6 of this year he resigned, according to tradition, after an attempt had been made on the life of the Emperor.

Stays in Office
But Emperor Hirohito requested the members of the cabinet to stay in office. The Minseito party

launched an attack against the Seiyukai party for continuing in power.

Premier Inukai dissolved the Diet on January 21, and called a general election. This resulted in an even more overwhelming vote for the Seiyukai party than ever before.

Inukai had been a cabinet member since before. That was under the Kato government in 1924 and 1925. At that time there was also an attempt to assassinate the Emperor, and the cabinet resigned.

His Beginning
He became active in politics in 1882 when he organized the Constitutional Progressive party. This was at the beginning of constitutional government in Japan. In that year

he was elected to the Tokyo local assembly.

All through his political career he has stood for constitutionalism. His reputation was of the highest and his integrity was unquestioned.

"The Old Gray Fox," as he was known because of his shrewdness and his small but quick figure, was born in Okayamaken in 1855. In his youth, before his actual entrance into politics, he was a journalist.



