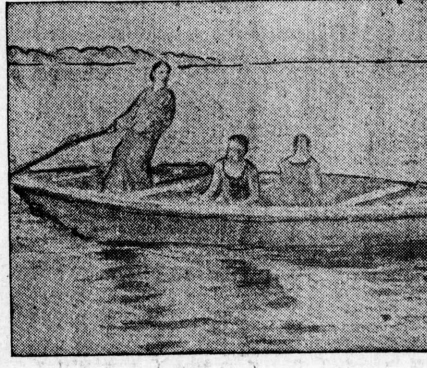

## ACE FORCED BACK IN HOP FOR NIPPON

### Oil Line Leak Causes Return To Seattle For New Takeoff

(Special to Japanese American News) SEATTLE, May 30—The misfortune of a broken oil line after he had been in the air three hours and a lurching take off during which his plane narrowly escaped from crashing, today failed to daunt Nathan O. Browne, New York flyer, on his projected nonstop flight to Tokyo.

After his plane had slowly struggled into the air with its heavy load of gasoline, scraping a tree top and breaking a stabilizer wire at 5:20 a. m. yesterday morning, he returned to the field seven and one-half hours later.

He had been temporarily blinded by hot oil when a pipe line broke somewhere over Vancouver Island. The great red ship, Lone Star, was set down again at 12:50 p. m. Mechanics immediately set to work on the engine and Browne was given medical treatment.

Seen South of City During his several hours in the air he was sighted south of the city, at Auburn, over Tacoma, by a ship in Puget sound and over Straights of Juan de Fuca.

He reached the northern shores of Vancouver Island before the oil line broke. "I was flying at a low altitude," he related, "and I had a pretty narrow escape. I just did manage to wipe the oil out of my eyes and off my goggles in time."

Last night he was again busy in Boeing field, making preparations for a refueling today over the city in a final attempt to get away from Seattle with sufficient gasoline to make the 5000-mile flight across the Pacific.

The \$30,000 prize for a Seattle to Tokyo hop will expire on midnight Wednesday.

Soldiers Gas Tank He presciently supervised the soldering of a gas tank for the refueling plane, and said he hoped to get a load of at least 950 gallons in the tanks of the Lone Star before finally heading toward the ocean.

He will take off with a reasonable load of gas, he said, some 600 or 600 gallons and then fly over the bay and drop his landing gear to rid himself of all unnecessary weight.

As a height of some 2500 feet, he said, the refueling attempt would be made.

A parachute jumper will accompany him, and descend to earth after the refueling is completed.

Neither the assistant nor the plane to carry gasoline had been definitely chosen early this morning.

Attempt at Dawn The attempt will be made soon after dawn, he said. Meanwhile Browne's daring flying in taking off the field yesterday morning was praised by aviators who watched him. Near the end of the 4200 foot runway he was not yet in the air, with trees brush and wires ahead.

Valving some 25 or more gallons of gas, the heavily laden ship lurched, took the air by a narrow margin and struggled along to the south, fighting for altitude.

A tree top was grazed, breaking a stabilizer wire, which probably would have been disastrous if he continued over the ocean rather than returning here.

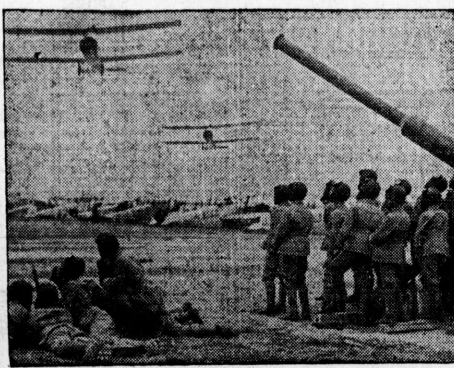

SAN JOSE, May 30—North central California sumo championship title was won by the Fresno team, which tied with San Jose for 23 points at the sumo tournament held Sunday afternoon at the local dohyo on Sixth st. Fresno was given the championship pennant by the league committee, which decided to award it to the invaders as against the home team wrestlers.

Ryumonzan, brilliant San Jose wrestler, was declared the greatest individual champion, although three others never suffered a defeat during the tournament. They include Tachima and Yamamoto of Fresno in the boys' division, and Kaneko of San Francisco in the A division.

## OLD FOLKS' HOME BUILT Hawaii Japanese Care For Indigent In \$65,000 Home

HONOLULU, May 30—Simplicity marked the opening exercises of the new home for aged and indigent Japanese which was completed here recently on a 2-acre site behind the Japanese hospital on Kuakini st.

A total of 20,057 individuals have contributed the sum of \$64,017.50, the report shows. The home was officially opened May 23.

Prince Takamatsu was the first to contribute to the fund, his donation of \$250 having been made when he passed through Honolulu June 2, 1931, homeward bound on his honey-moon trip around the world.

The Hawaiian Japanese Civic association which had backed the project from the start, succeeded in raising more than \$2000 in less than three days of campaign among the large business firms of the city.

## Bromley Shoots to L.A. from New York

NEW YORK, May 30—Harold Bromley, Canadian flyer in the World War, today was streaking across the continent, shooting for a new record in aviation.

He was flying a monoplane equipped with an oil-burning motor. This type of plane has never before been used in a transcontinental nonstop flying attempt.

In addition the flight was scheduled to be the first leg of a trans-Pacific hop.

Bromley plans to attempt to cross from California to Tokyo, although he had previously announced he had abandoned the trans-Pacific flight.

Shortly before he was ready to start, Bromley discovered a leak in one of his fuel tanks. It didn't appear to worry him. He said it was only a slow leak.

The plane with an oil motor for a heart, weighs about 2500 pounds. It carries 325 gallons of fuel oil, making its flying weight well over a ton.
