OAKLAND, June 3.—The 33rd annual conference of the 23 Japanese Methodist churches on the Pacific coast convened today at the local M.E. church, 10th and West st., for a four-day session.

The newly appointed Bishop, Rev. James C. Baker, will preside. A former resident bishop for Korea for the past four years, Rev. Baker was recently appointed head of the San Francisco area at the general Methodist conference held in Atlantic City.

Welcome Banquet

On Saturday night, June 4, 6 p.m., a welcome banquet for the new bishop and the delegates will be given by the hostess church, with about 150 in attendance. The affair will be held in the Meader hall of the Education building.

Sunday morning, June 5, will be devoted to a combined worship with the bishop delivering the sermon. In the evening, 7:30 p.m., there will be a meeting devoted especially to the young people of the East Bay area.

Miss Yuko Kuwahara, engaged in work with the Spokane church, is one of the young speakers. Also Taro Goto of Portland, second-generation student pastor of the Portland church, will speak on "It Takes Time to be Holy." Dr. Henry Takahashi will be the third speaker.

Bishop Will Speak

The main address will be given by Bishop Baker. The Y.M.D. Men's chorus from the San Francisco Japanese Y.M.C.A. and the young ladies' choir of the Oakland church will sing.

Monday, June 6th, will be the closing day of the conference, the main feature of which will be the appointments of the pastors to the various fields. On the same night there will be held at the Berkeley United church a welcome banquet for the delegates.
