Wife, Paramour, Fail In Suicide; Make Confession

LOS ANGELES, June 8—Infanticide to shield illicit love was confessed here, police said today, by a wife and her paramour who led their daughter on a ranch near Torrance.

Illicit Love Rinzaburo Kanda, 51, the husband had long searched for his wife, Ayako, 31, and his daughter Molly, 2, since their disappearance last Dec., and found her Sunday afternoon in an alleged illicit love relation with Hatamoto, near Torrance.

Police Attracted Attracted by the tussle, Police officers, who investigated the matter, held Ayako and Hatamoto on suspicion of first degree murder.

Ayako then confessed that he put the child's body in a sack and buried her at Torrance strawberry patch.
