KOIKE SETS NEW MARK IN TOKYO SWIM

Olympiad Trials for 200 Meters Made In 2 min. 17.6

TOKYO, June 13—Reizo Koike broke into the lime light during the Olympic swim trials here at the Meiji natatorium Saturday when he flashed over the line a winner in the 200 meter breast stroke event in what is believed to be a new world record for that event at 2 minutes 17.6 seconds.

In addition to Koike, the Japan swimming association selected 21 other swimmers and 6 mermaids and 1 woman diver, Etsuko Kamakura on the list made public today.

Matsuzawa Is Coach I. Matsuzawa has been officially confirmed as the head coach of the Japan swimming team, while K. Noda will be his assistant.

Concession Valued at \$45,000,000 Won From Turkey

LONDON, June 13—For a price placed at \$45,000,000 by informed quarters here a Japanese group from Osaka has obtained from Turkey a concession to work the State silk industry at Bursa, which has been idle for a century.

The Japanese, who will bring 2000 workmen from Japan, will pay the Turkish government a royalty of 25 per cent. The concession is for fifty years, but after the first ten years, no more Japanese may be brought into Turkey.

BOY ENTERS CRATER FOR TWO BODIES

Kunishi Is Lowered 900 Ft. to Recover Suicide Lovers

HONOLULU, Hawaii, June 13—A Japanese, Rikan Kunishi, a slim youth weighing only 85 pounds, scaled one of the most daring feats in modern history of the Islands, when he penetrated 900 feet below into the yawning mouth of the volcanic crater Halemauaha Sunday and brought up the bodies of a despairing lover and the sweetheart he killed.

Kunishi reached the rim of the frepit in a cage, suspended on cables, bringing up the bodies of Elyvester Nunes, 20 and Margaret Enoch, 17, from the ledge 900 feet below.

One Grand Job The Japanese will collect \$1000 for the task.

With a debonair air, Kunishi lit his cigarette as he was being lowered down into the fiery depths in a cage, which was manipulated by a winch.

As the descent started rocks were dislodged and thundered down as he swung out over the 1200-foot chasm and descended slowly.

In midair once the rope fouled and Kunishi signaled for a stop. He climbed out on his cage and adjusted the guide line while dangling personally in midair as spectators watched breathlessly through telescopes. Later he ordered a halt for five minutes in midair and took movies of the crater.

Eats Lunch Landing about thirty feet from the nearest body, that of the young girl, the midjet Japanese wrapped it in canvas. He then walked on loose rocks, holding on to a guide rope, to the body of Nunes, which he prepared in like manner.

This done, he calmly sat on a rock and ate his lunch—probably the most weird meal ever consumed—the raw meat of the world's largest semivolcanic volcano, with a splash of water and salt calmly in the cage as it made its ascent.
