PLAN OF U. S. HELD UNFAIR BY EXPERTS

Would not Give Japan Sufficient Defense Says Delegation

GENEVA, June 26—Japan's technical experts at the Geneva disarmament conference turned thumbs down today on President Hoover's proposal for a one-third slash in all classes of military weapons.

In a report by Japanese experts, the delegation declared itself "generally unfavorable" toward the proposal and put forward the following reasons:

- 1—The Basis of President Hoover's calculations is "unequitable."
- 2—The proposed army reductions would leave Japan with insufficient forces for national defense.
- 3—One-third reduction in the total tonnage of capital ships is unacceptable, but Japan agrees to a compromise reduction of maximum capital ship tonnage from 35,000 to 25,000 tons.
- 4—Japan is unable to accept non-replacement of cruisers.
- 5—Thirty-five thousand tons of submarines, as proposed by President Hoover, would be insufficient for Japan's coastal defense.

HOOVER AIRS HIS VIEWS ON JAPAN CRISIS

Slaying of Inukai Is Deplored in Talk With Publicist

WASHINGTON, June 26—I paid my respects to President Herbert Hoover of the United States at the White House, together with Ambassador Katsuyi Dehuchi, on June 1.

The President, with a quiet simplicity, gripped our hands. After expressing his thanks, he made allusion to the growing tendency toward violence in many countries of the world. He said, "I wonder how soon this deplorable tendency will cease? Your country has been affected also, has it not?" The recent assassinations shocked and dismayed us all. In this respect America and the European countries are little better. "In the death of Premier Inukai, your country has lost one of its ablest public servants, well versed in internal and international politics. I wonder what your leading thinkers propose to do with their country in the future?"

Miss Ito was connected with the editorial department of the Japan Times.

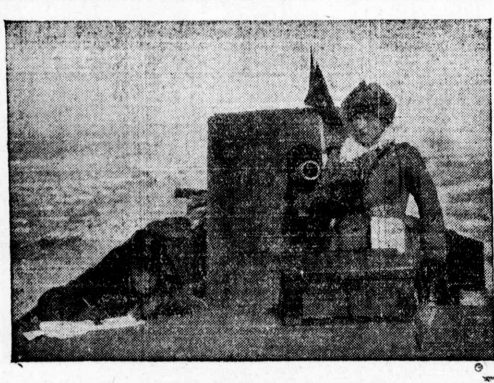
