YAMATO A. C. GET REVENGE

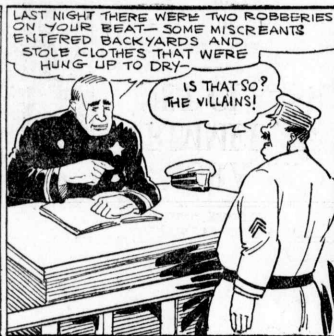
Stocktonians Humble Florin Ball Nine On Sunday
